

## **ADMISSION RULES**

of the Financial Congress of the Bank of Russia  
July 1-3, 2026

### **1. General Provisions**

1.1. These Rules set out the admission procedure for visitors to the Financial Congress of the Bank of Russia (hereinafter referred to as the Event). The Operator that establishes the rules of conduct for visitors to the Event is Effective Communications Limited Liability Company (INN 7716792536, OGRN 5147746475058, hereinafter referred to as the Operator).

1.2. Visitors may attend the Event only after reviewing and agreeing to these Rules.

1.3. These Rules apply to all categories of Event participants (including attendees, speakers, partners, media representatives, technical staff, volunteers, etc.).

### **2. Admission to the Event**

2.1. Preregistration is mandatory for attending the Event. The Operator reserves the right to refuse registration without providing a reason.

2.2. Admission to the Event is permitted only upon presentation of an accreditation badge.

#### **2.3. Registration Procedure**

2.3.1. Registration is conducted via the Event's official website (<https://ifcongress.ru/ru>) by completing an online form. During registration, participants must provide accurate and complete personal information, confirm that they have read and agree to the Privacy Policy, and give written consent for their biometric data to be processed for the purpose of using a photograph as a personal identifier (hereinafter referred to as Consent to the Processing of Biometric Data).

2.3.2. The Operator sets the registration start and end dates and publishes them on the event's official website. On-site registration is not available.

2.3.3. After processing a registration application, the Operator will send a notification to the participant at the provided email address, either confirming or declining the registration.

2.3.4. If there is a fee to participate in the Event, the registration fee is paid after the Operator confirms the application. Information about the payment procedure and methods is available in the participant's Personal Account on the Event's official website and/or sent via email.

2.3.5. The Operator reserves the right to modify the Event program or list of speakers, or to cancel or reschedule the Event. If the Event is canceled, the Operator will notify registered participants and issue a full refund of any fees paid.

#### **2.4. Security Checks**

2.4.1. The Operator reserves the right to refer any participant's registration application to the Event Security Service for review.

2.4.2. If the Event Security Service issues a negative decision, the participant will not be permitted to attend the event.

2.4.3. If the Event Security Service makes a negative decision after the participant has paid to participate, the full amount shall be refunded.

2.4.4. The reasons for a negative decision by the Security Service or denial of access to the event will not be disclosed.

## 2.5. Admission Documents

2.5.1. Participants of all categories must have the accreditation badge in their possession at all times while on the event premises. The accreditation badge is a personal document.

2.5.2. Transferring the badge to third parties is prohibited. The Operator reserves the right to verify that the name on the badge matches the visitor's name. For verification purposes, the access control officer may request an identification document.

2.5.3. If a badge is lost, the participant must immediately contact the nearest registration desk to have a new one issued.

## 2.6. Procedure for Obtaining an Accreditation Badge

2.6.1. Badges will be issued once registration has been confirmed and the participation fee has been paid, if applicable, and a positive decision has been issued by the Event Security Service.

2.6.2. Information regarding the dates, locations, and operating hours of badge distribution points (registration desks) is published on the Event's official website and sent via informational mailings. This information is also made available in the Personal Account.

2.6.3. Participants must present an identification document and sign the Consent to the Processing of Biometric Data upon collecting the badge.

2.6.4. To collect a badge on behalf of another person, the third party must provide the registration desk staff with a duly executed power of attorney and a signed copy of the participant's Consent to the Processing of Biometric Data. The power of attorney form is available for download in the Personal Account.

## 2.7. Failure to Provide Consent/Denial of Attendance

2.7.1. If a participant fails to provide written Consent to the Processing of Biometric Data (either in person or through a representative), the Operator reserves the right to deny the participant access to the Event. Any previously paid fees will be refunded in full.

## 2.8. Admission Procedure

2.8.1. Access to the Event venue is permitted only through the security checkpoints equipped with turnstiles and metal detectors. These checkpoints are installed at locations determined by the Operator and/or venue management.

2.8.2. Participants must scan the barcode on their badge using the access control reader to enter the

event. Participants must also present their badge upon request by security personnel.

2.8.3. The amount of time spent at the Event venues is governed by the Event program, which is published on the Event's official website.

2.8.4. Participants must demonstrate that any electronic devices brought onto the Event premises (e.g., laptops, phones) are functional when passing through the security checkpoint. Devices must be charged.

2.8.5. Bringing any food or beverages into the Event venue is prohibited. Visitors are advised to use the catering outlets.

2.8.6. All Event participants are required to comply with the fire safety regulations established at the Event venues.

## 2.9. Grounds for Denial of Access or Removal from the Event

A visitor may be denied access to or removed from the Event in the following cases:

2.9.1. Failure to register or to make payment to the Operator's bank account, where participation in the Event is subject to a fee.

2.9.2. Refusal to undergo a personal security check, including refusal to present one's hand luggage and personal belongings for inspection.

2.9.3. Attempting to bring prohibited items into the Event, as specified in the Appendix to these Rules.

2.9.4. Attempting to enter areas or premises that are closed to visitors, or using employee or maintenance entrances or driveways.

2.9.5. Engaging in any of the following: disturbing public order; exhibiting aggressive behavior; or committing actions that, in the opinion of the Operator's representatives, pose a potential threat to visitors, participants, or property.

2.9.6. Failure to comply with these Rules, with the instructions of the Operator's representatives, and/or with the venue management, as well as obstructing these parties from performing their duties.

2.9.7. The participant was found to have provided false information during registration or attempted to gain access using another person's identity.

2.9.8. Absence of a positive decision from the Event Security Service.

2.9.9. On other grounds, where denial of access or removal from the Event is necessary to comply with the requirements of the legislation of the Russian Federation, the Event's security protocols, or the requirements of the venue management, as determined by the Operator.

## 3. Liability

3.1. If a visitor commits an unlawful act, they may be handed over to law enforcement authorities and held liable, either administratively or criminally, in accordance with the law.

3.2. Any material damage caused to the Operator's property, the Event venue's buildings, structures, or equipment, or the property of other individuals or legal entities, shall be compensated in accordance with the applicable legislation of the Russian Federation.

## List of Items Prohibited from Being Brought into the Financial Congress of the Bank of Russia

July 1-3, 2026

1. Explosives and their components, detonating devices, and items containing them.
2. Weapons of any type, such as firearms, pneumatic weapons, gas weapons, edged weapons, throwing weapons, and self-defense devices (including aerosol and gas devices, such as pepper spray and similar items), ammunition of any type, weapon components, and specialized equipment.
3. Sharp or piercing objects, knives, and other items that may be used as weapons or to cause bodily harm.
4. Devices and ware, including homemade items, that are not pyrotechnics but are used to disperse or spray various materials and substances (including air-powered confetti launchers).
5. Other items and ware, including homemade items, which may result in injury if used.
6. Any items that imitate prohibited items visually, including mockups and replicas.
7. Flammable and pyrotechnic substances and items (excluding matches and pocket lighters), such as signal flares, sparklers, and firecrackers, as well as chemical materials and other substances.
8. Items that can be used to make pyrotechnic devices or smoke.
9. Aerosol cans of any kind.
10. Flammable solids, flammable and combustible liquids, and combustible, compressed and liquefied gases.
11. Oxidizing substances and organic peroxides.
12. Toxic, poisonous, noxious, and caustic substances, radioactive materials, and corrosive substances.
13. Dye stuffs.
14. Narcotic drugs, psychotropic substances, and their precursors, including those contained in medications.
15. Medical syringes, injection needles, and other injection devices, where the need for such devices is not supported by confirmed medical indications, or where medical indications exist but the relevant supporting documentation is not provided.
16. Any bulk substances, regardless of volume.
17. Glass, metal, and tin containers of any kind, including containers, bottles, cans, thermoses, and flasks, as well as open containers of any type.
18. Liquids in excess of 500 ml, as well as liquids in non-factory packaging regardless of volume. Food products and beverages in any container and volume (including water, juices, snacks, sandwiches, fruits, confectionery products, thermoses, prepared food), with the exception of medicines and a clear plastic bottle of water up to 0.5 liters in factory packaging. Alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages of any kind.
19. Unmanned, radio-controlled, remotely controlled, and autonomous devices and models, including aerial (such as drones, aircraft models, gliders, kites, and similar devices), ground, and water

- (such as radio-controlled cars, boats, vessels, and similar devices), as well as their control systems, and launching and navigation equipment, and their components (including remote controls, antennas, FPV equipment, batteries, and other components).
20. Television, telecommunications, and other specialized equipment used for photo, video, or audio recording, transmission, reception, amplification, or signal relay, as well as for organizing radio communication and broadcasting (including walkie-talkies, repeaters, transmitters, receivers, scanners, satellite terminals, antennas, and similar devices), unless the participant has obtained appropriate accreditation or permission from the organizer.
  21. Musical instruments, wind-operated sound-producing devices, and other sound-reproducing equipment.
  22. Masks, helmets, and any other means of concealment, as well as items specifically designed to hinder identification.
  23. Body armor (bulletproof vests, body armor, except when medically necessary).
  24. Any animals, with the exception of guide dogs upon presentation of relevant documentation, as well as working dogs of canine units while performing their official duties.
  25. Materials of an extremist, offensive, or discriminatory nature are prohibited. This includes, in particular, materials containing Nazi attributes or symbols, attributes or symbols of extremist organizations, as well as materials aimed at discrimination of any kind against a country, individual, or social group based on race, color, ethnicity, national or social origin, gender, disability, language, or other status.
